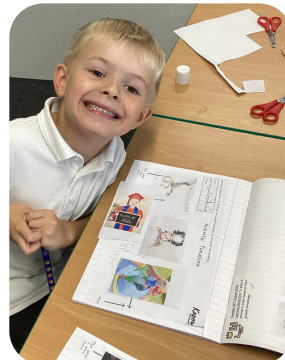
Mrs Southam's Class

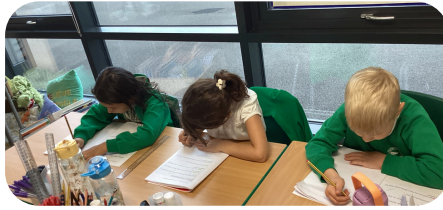
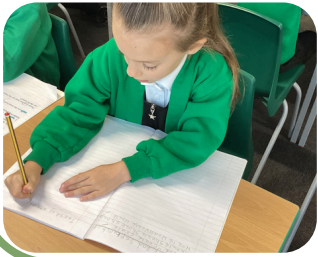


Miss Laverick's Class

Our new text in English is called 'Chapatti Moon' and we're currently learning to write a setting description based on the market place scene in this. In Maths we've been looking at place value within 100, with a specific focus on tens and ones.

Keep working hard Year 2- I am very proud of you all!

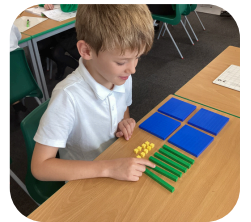


Mrs Bott's Class

In maths, we are continuing our learning about place value and the children have enjoyed using a range of manipulatives to support their understanding. Our afternoon lessons have been full of fun and discovery! So far, we have learnt how to count to 31 in Spanish; recognise different human teeth and their role in eating; how to use our bodies to create music and how the lives of children have changed from different periods of history.
