Miss Burrow's Class

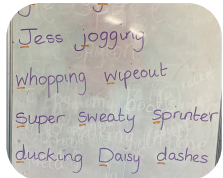
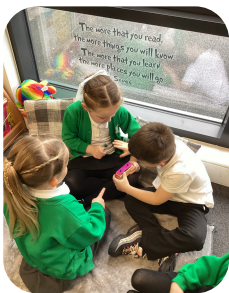
We started the term by showcasing our wonderful work in our sharing assembly. We also celebrated Shrove Tuesday - the children chopped some fruit to accompany their pancakes! We have celebrated World Book day and have been practising performing stories in our outdoor classroom.

This term we are learning all about keeping healthy and keeping safe. We have been drawing and writing about specific road safety rules in English and have focused our learning on why we have rules in the classroom and in school. The children have been exploring numbers to 10 in Maths and showing these different representations in many ways. We have also started our unit on pattern making and are now creating patterns in our learning environment.

Year 1 have been very busy learning new skills this week. In maths we are learning how to make equal groups in preparation for our multiplication skills. We have also been reciting our 2,5 and 10 times tables. In English, we have been learning how to use alliteration to make our acrostic poems more interesting. We found that using alliteration on more than two words in a row can be a bit of a tongue-twister! Finally, in music we have been practising our skills of pitch and tempo to create a superhero theme tune.
